

AC LM 46B Neon Bulb Spark Plug

One would think that all the unusually designed spark plugs were in the 1900-1920's era. The AC (Albert Champion) Spark Plug Company came out with an unusual plug in the 1960's era. It was an **AC LM46B** spark plug designed for lawn mower use, hence the LM designation. In the 1960's lawn mowers had their share of ignition problems where you weren't sure if "juice" was getting to the plug or not. The typical way of checking for this was to disconnect the spark plug wire and hold it a little away from terminal top of plug. There was nothing wrong with this method other than usually getting shocked in the process. Along comes the AC Company who designed a plug with an actual neon bulb which would illuminate when mower was in use, therefore eliminating the guesswork if mower was unable to be started. I believe that due to the delicate nature of the plug, that the green rings were hand painted at the factory. This plug would have originally been in a "blister pack" with graphics of a man mowing his lawn with the logo "Glow as you Mow". If you are looking to collect these rare plugs, be advised that an AC LM46 is **not** the neon version. Although physically looking the part, it is your run of the mill spark plug for lawn mower and other small engine apps. See photos below.
